The Graduate Diploma in Psychological Science provides a fourthyear qualification to students who have completed, with a high level of academic achievement, a Curtin BSc Psychological Science degree, (or equivalent). It provides an essential transition from the theorybased undergraduate degree program to an application-oriented postgraduate training in Psychology and prepares students for more advanced studies at master's level.

COURSE ESSENTIALS

Course entry requirements

- A 3-year Bachelor degree in Psychology from a recognised University or Graduate Certificate, i.e., an average of 65% and above calculated across 2nd and 3rd year level psychology units.
- Must meet Curtin English entry requirement IELTS 6.5 or equivalent

Duration

The program is run over one year.

Application procedures

Candidates must complete the application form available at Curtin Mauritius Future Students Centre and must submit relevant copies of the following documents:

- · Copies of educational qualifications
- Two passport size photographs
- · Copy of National Identity Card and Birth Certificate

(The originals of the above documents are needed for certification purposes)

PROFESSIONAL RECOGNITION & COURSE ACCREDITATION

To register as a Psychologist with the Mauritian Allied Health Professional Council (AHPC), a candidate is required to complete a minimum of 5 years of academic study in Psychology at tertiary level. The Graduate Diploma constitutes the 4th year of a 5-year training pathway*.



N.B. This pathway is NOT accredited by the Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC) but is recognized by the AHPC as an acceptable component of their required 5-year pathway for registration locally.
